# Nursery Rhymes Compiled by Tamara Álvarez



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### A page for teachers,

The aim of this booklet and its audio component (CD attached) is to provide traditional and useful resources on nursery rhymes and songs you can use in the classroom as a complementary resource to the contents being exposed to the students. This booklet provides a chart where the topic and track is indicated; warming up activities and lyrics are presented following the number of resource indicated in the chart.

Teaching sounds in class should always be presented as an engaging activity where students are exposed to the sounds through several activities; such as the use of songs, rhymes and stories, among others; in which these sounds can be elicited while the activity is being carried out or after it, but never before. This is tuned within the Child's Language Acquisition Process, Communicative Approach and Total Physical Response (from now on TPR).

Teaching pronunciation strategies take place in every single moment, which is when:

1. The teacher is speaking and giving instructions, he/she is being a role model and therefore the articulation of sounds and instructions should be appropriate.

2. Introducing activities which aim to a particular phoneme or cluster. Teachers should introduce the sound in a dynamic and didactic manner, simulating games and referring to the students' previous knowledge.

For example, if the initial/s/sound is to be introduced, teacher can simulate the sound of a snake and ask the children using TPR to imitate the movement of the snake with their arm as they articulate the sound/s/. On another case, if the initial cluster/st/is being introduced, the same game mentioned in the previous example for/s/can be used and then explain that the snake is hungry and when that happens, the snake stops moving by using the sound/t/ (which can be repeated many times). In the end, children can play by making the snake move by pronouncing/s/ and making the snake stop by pronouncing/t/ so a game articulating the cluster/st/ takes place.

3. Once the target sound has been presented naturally, with no further explanation and as a game, other pronunciation resources can be used, such as rhymes, stories and songs which reinforce the exposition to the sound. Teachers can make reference to the warming up activity in which the sounds were presented and highlight it.

In sum, sounds should always be presented as a game to students and constantly reflected in the teachers as role models. There are several activities that can be used to present the phoneme or cluster (warm up activity) or to reinforce it once the sounds has

been introduced, these are stories, rhymes, tongue twisters, chants or games such as giving instructions which involve TPR.

It is common for teachers to become a bit nervous when using new resources or activities, especially in the area of pronunciation, but there is nothing as effective for a child to do, perform and articulate sounds. Hence, the teacher's role is a key element to engage the child's eagerness to learn, imitate and play following the teacher's guidelines.



### Patterned Name Art

Patterns come in many shapes, sizes and colors. As your child alters one element and then another, this particular set of patterns will form her name in a piece of artwork that's as unique as she is.

### What You Need:

- Paper
- Pencil
- · Markers, crayons or colored pencils


### What You Do:

- What patterns fascinate your child? Perhaps it's the repetition found in nature ranging from the stripes on a tiger to the spots on a jaguar. Or, it might be the bold geometric prints in Native American beadwork.
- As you talk about patterns, have your child use the pencil to draw her name in large block letters. The letters should be big enough to fill with clearly visible patterns.
- Have your child create a pattern to fill in the first letter in her penciled name. For this example, we used a combination of red checks and lines.
- 4. Fill the next letter with the same pattern but alter one element of the pattern. It can be a change in color or a shape or line. In this example, we removed the lines and have created a similar pattern with only red checks.
- Again, fill the next letter making one change in the pattern used in the previous letter. This time we changed the color for a pattern of blue checks.
- Continue changing one element at a time, letter by letter, until the entire name is filled in. Our example started with a pattern of red stripes and checks, and finished with with a pattern of blue stripes and checks.

Expand on this project by creating a whole series of patterned names. In one, change only the color. In another change only the scale, or size, of the pattern. How many different ways can you vary this and what is the effect in each?









### **HOW TO PLAY**


In the game of Memory, players try to collect pairs of matching cards.

- 4. The player with the most matching sets of cards at the end of the game wins.












